## JEAN FELDSTEIN

### Volunteer of the Year Award



Following Jean Feldstein's untimely death in 2009, the Board of Directors of Jewish Family Service of Lancaster established a Volunteer of the Year award in her honor, as she embodied outstanding volunteerism in her daily life. Jean was a dedicated member of the JFS Board between 2000-2009 and during that time, she served as the organization's treasurer, editor of its ad book, and representative to the Jewish Community Alliance of Lancaster's board.

Jean was also an active member at Temple Beth El and in its Sisterhood, serving on many committees, including the search committees for three rabbis. She was Editor of the *Temple Beth El Bulletin* and was the major designer of the sanctuary in the synagogue's Rohrerstown Road building. In 1995, she was recognized as Congregant of the Year. In addition, Jean volunteered in the general community by serving on the Youth Activities Committee of the West Hempfield Police Department. Her knowledge, experience, and skills were used to assist at-risk youth, giving them the opportunity to avoid entering the legal system.

## STEVE KLEINMAN

### Jean Feldstein Volunteer of the Year



Steven J. Kleinman was born in Brooklyn, N.Y., and grew up in New Milford, N.J. During his working years, Steve was employed by various companies in Connecticut, New York, Minnesota, and Pennsylvania. He moved to Pennsylvania in 1987. After retiring in 2016, he has spent much of his time as a volunteer for various Lancaster organizations, including Temple Beth El, the Jewish Community Alliance of Lancaster (JCAL), CareerLink (helping people with technology who were looking for jobs), and VITA (doing tax returns for low to moderate income people at no charge). Most recently, he has been volunteering as the Treasurer for three Lancaster 501(c)(3) organizations, including Jewish Family Service of Lancaster.

Steve also served as a substitute Meals on Wheels delivery person, and helped with meals at Crispus Attucks and at churches under the auspices of Temple Beth El during holiday times. He has also helped numerous people and organizations with computer and technology-related issues, often in retirement home settings. In tandem with his wife, Carolyn, who volunteers to assist immigrants in learning English as a Second Language, he has helped out with various life skills trainings (for instance, how to navigate the DMV). He has also volunteered to give people rides for medical appointments over the years.

Through his many endeavors, performed mostly in the background, but always given his full attention, Steve has made a difference in the lives of numerous Lancastrians.

## RHEA AND PHIL STARR

### Social Justice Award

#### About Phil and Rhea Starr



Phil and Rhea Starr believed in working with the community to solve problems of inequity wherever they saw them.

For Phil, that meant working to get food to the hungry. He began in Lancaster by delivering food to the Central PA food bank and later working to help found the PA Food Bank. When he went to work for the

Southeast Lancaster Health Center, he learned more about how underserved the poor's health needs were. He worked with the Board of Southeast Lancaster Health Center to grow the Center from a two-room entity to a full-scale Center that has continued growing to serve the entire County. When he learned of the needs of the children in the school system, he wasn't satisfied to just improve his children's education, he went on the school board of Lancaster to improve all the children.

For Rhea, it meant working to meet the needs of parents and children by providing quality child care at the Lancaster YWCA. She took a babysitting program to meet the highest standards of a 4-Star child care program, provided the first infant and toddler care program in Lancaster County, as well as Employer Supported Child Care for Lancaster General Hospital. She served as Chair of the Fair Housing Committee of the County Human Relations Committee where they secured funding for a film on redlining to be shown to all real estate salespersons. Under her leadership, the YWCA Advocacy Committee held programs on anti-Semitism, atomic power, and improving funding conditions for women and children. After going to work for the YWCA of the USA, she worked on these and other issues in several different roles, ending with seven years as Director of Child Care where, among other things, she served on the Advisory Board for the White House Conference on Child Care.

Following Phil's death in 2021, The Board of Directors of Jewish Family Service of Lancaster established the Phil and Rhea Starr Social Justice Award to honor individuals who work to better support the needs of marginalized communities in Lancaster County, thus carrying on the Starrs' meaningful work.

## ISMAIL SMITH-WADE-EL

### Rhea and Phil Starr Social Justice Award



Prior to his election to the PA Legislature, Ismail "Izzy" Smith-Wade-El was the President of Lancaster City Council on which he had served since 2017. During his four years on Council, Izzy helped secure the largest investments in affordable housing and lead removal for the City of Lancaster in its history. He championed the decriminalization of cannabis; a completely revamped use-of-force policy for police officers; and increased police accountability in response to community requests.

Izzy was born and raised in Lancaster. After graduating from Carnegie Mellon University, Izzy returned to his hometown and began working in Lancaster's nonprofit sector to deliver relief to vulnerable people, first in behavioral health and drug and alcohol rehabilitation, then as a grant writer and researcher. As a program specialist at Lancaster County Homeless Coalition, he coordinated services and support for Lancaster County's housing insecure community. Most recently, Izzy launched "Refresh Lancaster," a mobile hygiene unit which delivers showers, social services, and medical attention to homeless Lancasterians.

Izzy has fought for grassroots change in his community as the vice chair of the Lancaster County Democratic Party, as a community organizer with striking Kellogg's workers for fair wages and benefits, and with PA's educators to demand fair funding for public schools. He's raised his voice to protect abortion access, defend Black Lives, welcome immigrants and refugees, and denounce antisemitism.

## ISMAIL SMITH-WADE-EL Rhea and Phil Starr Social Justice Award

Izzy is the first Black and first queer state representative from Lancaster.

His inspiration for his life and work as a public servant is the example of his mother, Rita Smith-Wade-El, who was a professor at Millersville University, a union member, community organizer and single mom. His mom always made a point of helping others, even when she had little for herself. She taught Izzy that when you have something to give, you give it, and if you don't have it to give, you get more to give.

Izzy has come to Harrisburg to partner with like-minded legislators to correct the Commonwealth's laws that favor giant corporations, lobbyists, and a status quo that hurts working families. Those laws prevent the leveling of the playing field for friends and neighbors. He will advocate for legislation that puts power to the shared values of kindness, welcome, dignity, and care. Izzy draws his values from his family, his Catholic faith, and his community.

## JFS Annual Activities Report

This past year has once again witnessed the growth of Jewish Family Service and its strong presence in the Lancaster community. The office continued to be open with volunteer staff for six hours per week, allowing for in-person answering of phones and distribution of durable medical equipment. Almost \$6,500 in tzedakah was distributed to those in need in the community.

The Durable Medical Equipment (DME) Program loaned medical equipment such as crutches, wheelchairs, and more to residents in the Lancaster area. Most often, the borrowers were referred after being discharged from Lancaster General Hospital. In appreciation for our services, LGH has made a donation to JFS. JFS would like to thank community members for generously donating equipment that the donors no longer needed.

JFS also forged relationships with the VFW Post in Lititz and Grace Church in Lititz, providing DME when requested. Surplus equipment was given to the Leola Thrift Shoppe and Matthew 25 in Lititz, as well as the New Holland Ambulance Association and the LEMSAs training facility.

The JFS and Franklin & Marshall's Hillel partnership remains strong with Hillel members volunteering to answer phones and create a database for the DME. The inclusion of Hillel members has brought a new generation of volunteers into the organization. In addition, Julia Dorf and Mackenzie Sherman, F&M students and members of Hillel, served on the JFS Board.

JFS continues to be an essential and viable part of the community. We deeply appreciate your support during these challenging times and welcome your involvement in our mission.

The fundraising strategy that was implemented last year proved to be moderately successful. Rather than changing strategies after a one-year trial, the Board of Directors has decided to allow this

new strategy to remain in place as community members continue to become comfortable with the new process. To review, our strategy is to run a weeklong campaign via email to solicit donations sometime in early fall. Additionally, JFS will also participate in the Lancaster Extraordinary Give, a community-wide giving program run by the Lancaster County Community Foundation in November. Finally, a written, end-of-year appeal will be sent to anyone who has not donated during either the online campaign or the Extra Give. Our goal is to conserve resources, consolidate our efforts, and focus on our mission.

The Board continues to use multiple communication methods to reach those interested in furthering the work of JFS—these include an updated website with an online donation portal that allows members of the community to make one-time or recurring contributions, and a timely e-newsletter. It is our expectation that by providing multiple points of contact, we will be able to reach a wider audience and magnify the work of JFS.

As JFS enters the new year, members of the Board have worked industriously at revising the recruitment process and seek community members with the skills that will continue to allow the organization to be viable and visible. We seek board members who are willing to assume active leadership roles. We also welcome energetic and motivated volunteers who will serve on various organizational committees and as ambassadors in the community as we work to achieve our mission of helping the most vulnerable individuals and families achieve well-being, health, and stability through a wide range of services and educational offerings. Our hope is to expand and diversify so we can best serve the residents of Lancaster County. Please remember the only requirement to be a JFS volunteer is a willingness to commit time and energy to realizing the primary goal of JFS . . . **To Help People!**






